

Keys to Effective Song Leading

Choose the right song

- Use rowdy songs to gain a group's attention, or get a group excited.
- Use quiet songs after quiet activities, or as a transition.

Know the song

- Practice before leading a new song.
- Be confident, or know you can "wing it."
- Always sing from memory. It's better to screw up than bore everyone.

Get the group's attention

- Start with a yell or cheer.
- Use a repeat or action song you don't have to teach.
- Be energetic

Sing

- Use a loud, controlled voice.
- Over-enunciate words.
- Be enthusiastic, it's contagious.
- Take a risk, act like a fool.
- Teach new songs before singing.
- Only introduce 1 or 2 new songs each time.
- Limit campfires to 90 minutes or less.

Recover

- Drink lots of water.
- Use a salt water gargle if you're throat's sore.

TIPS FOR THE SONG LEADER

A good song leader can make the tribal songfest a real treat. Children and parents respond to good music and appreciate someone who will help them sing well together. Try these ideas:

- Be enthusiastic; help members enjoy singing as they learn.
- Know the songs you are leading. Begin with one that most of the members know and enjoy.
- Sing along with the group and enjoy yourself.
- Give information about the background of the song.
- Make sure that the group hears the pitch. Don't start too high or too low.
- Give a firm starting signal and set and maintain the tempo of the song.
- Indicate when the group should sing loudly or softly and when to stop together!
- Use action songs when you want to provide movement and energetic involvement. Clapping, stamping feet, standing, and using hand motions all add zest to the occasion.
- Give clear, concise instructions for action songs. Repeat, if necessary, for better understanding.
- Use small, steady, rhythmic beats to guide the group. A broad, clear arm movement works best with large groups. Keeping the rhythm steady is a key to success.

Select songs appropriate for the meeting situation. Rousing choruses and action songs get parents and children off to a good start. Quiet songs have a great impact at campfires and tribal meetings just before the story or devotions. The following songs are a few suggestions, but try other songs that the tribe enjoys. Take time to prepare,

Tortilla Melts

Ingredients (per tortilla):
a soft tortilla
various bits of chocolate, caramels, and marshmallows
banana & apple slices

Directions: Take a piece of foil and make a 'plate' for the tortilla. Place tortilla on it. Next place your choice of toppings. Fold the tortilla in half and wrap in the foil. Heat in the campfire coals (or on a grill, or on a vagabond stove) for about 5 minutes on each side. You'll know they're done when you when you smell the chocolate! Be sure to let them cool a little before you eat them or you'll burn your tongue.
