What To Bring

(Everything has to be personally carried onto and off the boat and to your tents)
Soft duffle Bags preferred, they will be piled up on board during passage:

- ❑ Sleeping bag
- ❑ Pillow
- ❑ Toiletries
- ❑ Towels (beach and bath)
- ❑ Bathing suit
- ❑ Hat
- ❑ Sunscreen, sun-blocking lip balm
- ❑ Sunglasses
- ❑ Clothing for 3 days
- ❑ Footwear (hiking, beach)
- ❑ Day pack
- ❑ Warm clothes for evening
- ❑ Flashlight
- ❑ Light windbreaker/raincoat (just in case)
- ❑ Ceremonial vest, headband, etc.

Optional:

- ❑ Snacks & water (also available at camp snack bar during restricted hours)
- ❑ Wetsuit for snorkeling/swimming
- ❑ Personal Snorkeling gear, remember contact lenses for under the mask!
- ❑ Travel games
- ❑ Books
- ❑ Sea sickness medication
- ❑ Beach chairs
- ❑ Campfire accoutrements (guitar, drums, rain-sticks, etc.)
- ❑ Extra blanket
- ❑ Sunday early morning snack

Provided

- Large enclosed canvas tents on platforms with 6 two high bunk beds with mattresses.
- Running water Restrooms
- Warm Showers
- Sports equipment (soccer, basketball, volleyball, baseball, archery)
- Kayaks, canoes, life vests
- Meals (Friday dinner 6pm; Saturday breakfast 8am, lunch 12, dinner 6; Sunday brunch 10ish)

Average temperatures in Late October are high: 71°, low: 55°, and water: 65°.
