Directions to Camp

- Take your favorite route to the San Bernardino Freeway (Interstate 10) and head east towards the city of Redlands.
- When you reach the Redlands area, take the University Street exit.
- Turn left (north) onto University Street.
- Turn right (east) onto Lugonia Avenue (1.63 miles)
- Continue on Lugonia Avenue, heading east. Lugonia Avenue becomes Mentone Blvd. (0.98 miles), which in turn becomes Mentone Blvd./Highway 38 (1.02 miles). Mentone Blvd./Highway 38 becomes Mill Creek Road/Highway 38 (3.14 miles).
- Continue east on Highway 38 up the mountain, heading towards Angelus Oaks.
- Continue past Angelus Oaks, heading towards Barton Flats. Camp Arbolado is 7.5 miles past Angelus Oaks. The gravel/dirt entry road is on your left off of Highway 38 (indicated by the red star on the map above). Watch for the Barton Flats Forest Service Information Center on the right hand side. The camp entry road is less than 1/4 mile past this point.

Side Notes....

- ❑ No dinner will be served on Friday night, so please plan on eating before going to camp. If you choose to eat on the road make sure you stop at the foot of the hill on Jenks Rd W since there are limited food places available on the mountain.
- ❑ If possible, try to leave around lunchtime on Friday since the traffic gets backed up starting at 2:30pm.
- ❑ If there is snow, make sure to bring extra clothes since the ones you play in get wet.
- ❑ If there is no snow, bring shoes to hike in and also bring board games to share with others.
